

Application for a Study Permit

All students who are not Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada will require a valid study permit. [Application processing timelines](#) vary considerably from one country to another so you are encouraged to initiate the process as quickly as possible to avoid disappointment and a delay in your child being permitted to enter Canada. Please note: You may need to [give biometrics](#) with your application. The published processing time **does not include** the time required to provide biometrics.

Once you have paid the first installment of tuition fees (February 15th):

Receive official Letter of Acceptance (LOA form) from [Alec Louis-Seize](#) for your application for study permit.

Custodianship: all students who are not Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada will require a guardian/custodian living within 5 - 6 hour drive from Ottawa.

- If you know someone (relative, friend, associate) who can serve in this role, have them sign and have notarized a [Custodianship Declaration](#) (see [IRCC website](#) for more information).
- If you do not know someone who can serve in this capacity, we recommend the services of [ISGC](#) or [CHN](#). Please contact them to arrange for a Custodianship Declaration.
